A View from the Summit...

A unique cure for toothaches revealed!

Ladybugs are a type of beetle and there are about 4,300 different species. They are also known as lady beetles. Ladybugs come in both sexes. The female is usually the larger of the two. A female ladybug will lay eggs that will hatch larvae. The larvae are called alligators because they look like very tiny alligators. They are the exact opposite in color of ladybugs, which are red with black spots. The larvae are black with red spots. The larvae survive on aphids for three weeks. Aphids are a type of insect that is the choice of food for ladybugs. If they do not have aphids to eat they will eat other soft-shelled insects or pollen. They, then, attach themselves to a leaf for one more week during their pupal stage. Within several days they develop their spots. Ladybugs can have between 2-15 spots. The number of spots will help identify what kind of ladybug it is.

Ladybugs are usually 4-7 mm in length, with oval bodies. The red shell with spots is called an elytra which protects the softer wings underneath. The wings under the elytra are thin enough to see through. Ladybugs have six legs with organs on their feet to help them smell.

Ladybugs have been considered good luck for many centuries. One reason being, they eat the insects that destroy crops. In medieval times, after the hop plants were harvested, the farmers would burn the crops to clear the fields. The ladybugs flew away, the larvae crawled away, and the pupa would stay attached to the

This week we shine on **St. Georgen Keller Bier**. Try one at your favorite Summits today!

St. Georgen Keller Bier
Region of Origin: Franconia, Bavaria, Germany
Style: Kellerbier/ Unfiltered Pilsner

In Germany, Pilsner beers are normally filtered; this beer is not, and therefore it is, strictly speaking, a Kellerbier (taken from the cellar while still hazy). Nonetheless, it is of typical Pilsner strength, with a superbly appetizing, fresh, flowery, hop character. The hop is balanced by a lightly nutty maltiness and a yeasty acidity in the finish. The beer is made by St. Georgen, at Buttenheim in Bavaria, near the great brewing town of Bamberg.

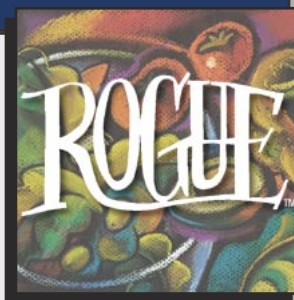

Drink Sends Bank Robber to Sleep on Heist

GRAZ, Austria (Reuters) - A man went to rob a bank in the Austrian city of Graz but was found by police asleep in his car after downing a bottle of schnapps for courage, police say.

A passer-by alerted the police after noticing that the parked car had different number plates at the front and back, a police spokesman told Reuters Tuesday.

On the seat next to the slumbering driver police found a balaclava, a pistol and an empty bottle of high-proof schnapps.

The 33-year-old man admitted he had planned to rob the bank but had drunk the schnapps to calm his nerves. He was arrested for questioning and will have to answer charges of attempted robbery in court.
