A View from the Summit

My Favorite Beer Experience

Over the course of my life I have had many great beer experiences, too many to mention, in fact. I would like to share a few of my favorites now. I am sure that there are many that I cannot remember because I was experiencing the beer a little too much.

Maybe it was Boston Red Sox opening day in 1979. I was 10 years old and my mother let me stay home from school to watch the game with my uncle Peter. Peter is my Irish uncle, if you do not have an Irish uncle, I suggest you get one immediately. Peter told me that if the Sox won that day, he would give me a beer.

The Red Sox prevailed over the Cleveland Indians 7-1 and thus began my illustrious drinking career. My first taste of that sudsy brew was a Pabst Blue Ribbon. I can distinctly remember popping open that can of beer and having my first taste, although things get a little fuzzy after that. It was a little bitter, very carbonated and very cold. I probably drank about half of that beer before I started to get a little looped, and I doubt that I actually finished it, but a beer drinker was born.



Another time that sticks out in my mind occurred in 1988. I was living in Providence, Rhode Island. My sister, her husband and another friend of ours and I all shared a house. Kevin, my brother-in-law, and I had just finished softball practice on a scorchingly hot July afternoon. As we were walking back to my 1975 Lincoln Towncar, which was black, of course, Kevin mentioned how good an ice cold beer would taste when we got home. Well, I thought, if a beer would taste

good if we were this hot and sweaty, it would taste even better if we were hotter and sweatier, right? Well, Kevin thought so, so we agreed to make the 20 minute ride home in my black Towncar (Which, incidentally is 19 feet 6 inches from bumper to bumper) without air conditioning, and with the windows rolled up. The car was probably 120 degrees when we got in, and I can assure you that it did not cool down on the ride home.

By the time we pulled into the driveway, we were both literally drenched with sweat. Getting out of that sauna into the mere 90 degree heat felt like stepping into a refrigerator. But when we sat on the front porch and popped open those Rolling Rock longnecks, it was pure heaven. I don't recommend this method for enjoying a cold beer, but it is effective.

Probably one of my most memorable beer experiences was my first beer dinner with Summits. It was in 1997 and we invited John Maier, the head brewmaster at Rogue Brewery to Atlanta for a beer dinner to honor his beer.

Although great beer was flowing freely, it wasn't the beer that made the event so special, it was the people. Working with all of the other managers and preparing a great meal for an eager audience was something special. Watching all of our guests enjoy the fruits of our labor is something that I will never forget. It was a long day that included a lot of hard work, but I've rarely had more fun in my life.

Looking back through the years, I have had the opportunity to have a lot of great beer experiences, but it's the people that really make those experiences so special. I look forward to many more great beers, and great people.

Cooking With Beer!

Roast Pork in Beer Sauce à la Spaten

Ingredients:

- 1.5 kg (3.5 lbs) shoulder of pork
- Mixture of salt, pepper and paprika
- Garlic paste
- 2 teaspoons of caraway seeds
- 1/4 l (one cup) of hot water or bouillon
- 2 onions
- 1 leek or shallots
- 2 carrots
- 1/2 to 3/4 l (2-3 cups) of Spaten Münchner Hell beer

Preparation:

Score the rind and fatty layer of the pork shoulder into diamond-shape patterns and rub it well with garlic paste and a mixture of salt, pepper and paprika. Sprinkle with caraway seeds.

Preheat the oven to 220° C (428° Fahrenheit) or, when using circulating air, to 200° C (390° Fahrenheit). Place the roast on a roasting tray, rind downwards, and put it in the oven.

After about 10 minutes, baste with water or bouillon. Turn the roast and add the onions, shallots and carrots. Leave in the oven for about 60 minutes at 180° C (356°

Fahrenheit) or, when using circulating air, at 160° C (320° Fahrenheit). Gradually pour the beer over the roast.

Remove from oven after the rind has turned a crispy brown.

Strain the sauce and season to taste.

Serve with potato dumplings and combination of sliced apples and red cabbage.

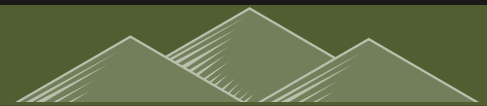
