Burger Month will begin Friday, September 1st and continue the entire month of September! Please join us for some great burgers and assist in helping out the Georgia Transplant Foundation.

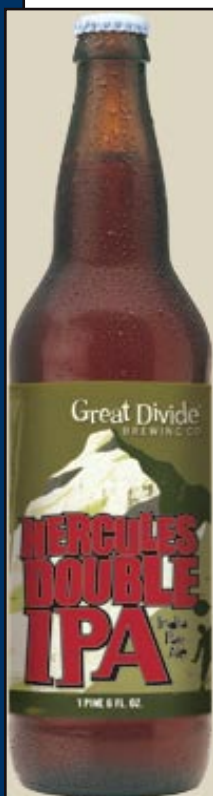

Cooking With Beer

Clam Beer Appetizers Recipe

- 1 stick (1/4 pound or 8 Tablespoons) butter, at room temperature
- 1/2 cup fine bread crumbs
- 1/4 cup beer (clam juice may be substituted)
- 1 small sweet onion, minced
- 4 garlic cloves, minced
- 2 tablespoons minced fresh parsley
- 1 teaspoon basil
- 1/2 teaspoon dried oregano
- 1/2 teaspoon rosemary
- 1/8 teaspoon ground red pepper
- Salt and freshly ground pepper to taste
- 4 small (6-1/2 ounces) cans minced clams, drained (juice reserved)
- 36 toasted baguette slices
- 1/2 cup grated Parmesan cheese

PREPARATION:

Preheat oven to 375 F. Line baking sheets with Silpats or lightly grease.

Combine butter, bread crumbs, beer, sweet onion, garlic, parsley, basil, oregano, and rosemary.

Add salt and pepper to taste, and mix thoroughly. Stir in clams. Add additional clam juice if mixture appears too dry.

Spread clam mixture on toasted baguette slices. Bake for 10 minutes. Remove from oven and sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Increase oven heat to broil. Return clam rounds to oven and broil until golden. Serve hot.

Yield: 36 appetizers

Did You Know?

In the mid-1800s, Eberhard Anheuser was a successful manufacturer of soap and candles in St. Louis, Missouri, USA. In 1859, he financed a loan to a struggling neighbourhood brewery called The Bavarian Brewery, which was started by George Schneider in 1852. When the brewery faltered again in 1860, Anheuser and a partner, William O'Dench, bought the interests of minority creditors rather than see the brewery go under. They reorganised the company and resumed production under the name E. Anheuser & Company.
