The care packages are always appreciated but what this soldier expressed was her desire for a soft bed since the beds they sleep in are not so much so! So, Rita Scott went to a local retailer and purchased a dozen foam mattress pads and sent them abroad. She says that the response was amazing! She received such an outpouring of thanks that she continued to purchase and send the mattress pads overseas.

One hundred mattress pads later Rita is still going strong! You can imagine coming out of her personal pocket for these items became a bit overwhelming! She has since managed to find the distributor and purchase them direct to save costs. . . and there are TWO HUNDRED more mattress pads arriving at the end of November! This is where you can help.....

The Scotts have gotten organized and formed the non-profit organization called "Hero Support". It's the time of year we get together with friends and family – Thanksgiving and the holidays. Take a moment of this precious time and let you family know your wishes regarding organ and tissue donation. In Georgia, over 2600 potential recipients are on the waiting list for organs

How to become an organ donor:

As a resident of Georgia, you should take the following steps to ensure your decision to become a donor is carried out: Indicate your wishes on your driver's license or state ID when you apply for or renew it. Sign up on the Georgia Organ Donor Registry by signing and returning a donor card to Donate Life Georgia (1-866-57-SHARE).

FACTS:

Fact: Anyone can be a potential

donor regardless of age, race, or medical history.

Fact: All major religions in the United States support organ, eye and tissue donation and see it as the final act of love and generosity toward others.

Fact: If you are sick or injured and admitted to the hospital, the number one priority is to save your life. Organ, eye and tissue donation can only be considered after you are deceased.

Fact: When you are on the waiting list for an organ, what really counts is the severity of your illness, time spent waiting, blood type, and other important medical information, not your financial or celebrity status.

Fact: There is no cost to the donor or their family for organ or tissue donation.

What is the best way to pour beer?

Definitely into a clean glass or mug after a good rinse with cold water. Only then bubbles will not stick to the glass surface inside and the true amber color will show at its best. Draft beer is poured at one go - i.e. you open the tap once. Already got your mug? Try for Passport Club Tier II! This time you get to tour our bottled beers.



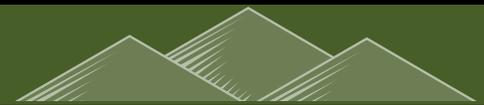
